Parish Lenten Talk We are delighted that Rabbi Dr Andrew Goldstein has kindly agreed to give a talk at 6.15pm on Sunday 11th March on 'If I forget thee O Jerusalem...a Jewish view of the Holy City". Jerusalem plays a central role in both our Faiths (as well as Islam) and the talk will tie in nicely to the Bible Timeline course, beginning on 26th February. Rabbi Goldstein is originally from Warwick and was Senior Rabbi for many years at the Northwood and Pinner Liberal Synagogue and has published widely. Please do make a note of the date in your diary!

Bible Timeline will be meeting at 7pm on five Mondays in Lent from 26th February to 26th March. All are welcome, even if you have not attended previous sessions. This course, based on DVD presentations, discussion and our own prayerful reading of Scripture, will help us discover the Old Testament and the way it is linked to the New Testament.
